## Several inches of snow in the forecast

Some employees have asked if the City anticipates any facility closures tomorrow if the storm brings the forecasted amounts of snow. The City's Emergency Management Team members are in close contact with the National Weather Service and receiving regular briefings. Forecasts have varied slightly over the past 24 hours, but the expectation is that Spokane could receive snowfall of several inches beginning most significantly in the overnight hours and into the evening on Wednesday.

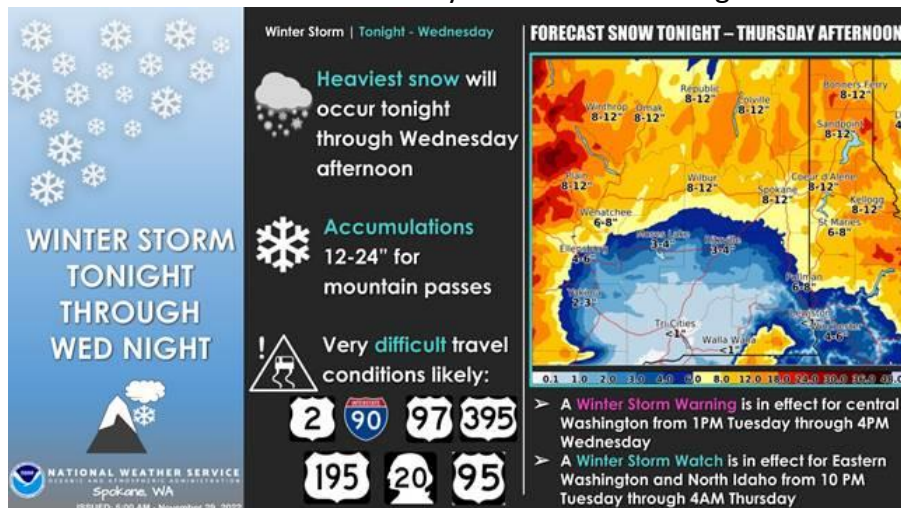
## City facilities open tomorrow

City facilities will be open and operating. Many employees are part of the City's snow response and are first responders to community needs. Employees with concerns about their commute tomorrow should discuss potential options with their department heads. Individual employee leave banks can also be accessed with supervisor approval.

## Public snow response plan

Streets has increased its overnight plowing and deicer crews tonight in anticipation of the expected storm. The focus will be on maintaining arterials, hill routes, and areas around hospitals and schools. How the storm develops and the accumulations of snow it brings will dictate when crews will be able to move into other areas.
