COVID-19 News Update for May 4

Information about Coronavirus Disease 19 (COVID-19) is evolving rapidly. We want to make sure our City employees have up-to-date information. We will provide this update, as needed, to communicate what you need to know, while we work to reduce the spread of this disease in our community and continue to provide critical public services.

Safe Start Washington - The Reopening Plan

On Friday, Washington Gov. Jay Inslee laid out a four-phase plan to reopen the Washington economy. Washington state currently is in Phase 1, with construction and other essential activities under way.

Outdoor activities and additional sales and retail activities begin tomorrow, Tuesday, May 5. Golf, fishing, hunting, and some park access is included starting tomorrow. Also, watch for vehicle sales, curbside pickup at retail outlets, car washing landscaping and some pet services.

Each subsequent phase builds the available activities in the earlier phase. <u>Check out this article</u> on the Governor's web site, and then <u>the detailed plan</u> of information.

The plan did include options for some counties with lower numbers of COVID-19 cases to open on a faster track. Mayor Nadine Woodward is expected to talk to the Governor tomorrow about an appropriate pan for Spokane.
