COVID Cases Surge in Spokane and the State

The Washington State Department of Health (DOH) held a news conference today to encourage citizens to take greater personal responsibility to help slow the spread of COVID-19. The news conference comes after Washington state broke two records for highest daily case count, according to DOH data. In Spokane, more than 1,400 people tested positive in the first nine days of November.

Health officials urged Washington citizens to take the risk of COVID-19 seriously and recalibrate their activities now to avoid the need for additional, mandatory restrictions. Reduce social interactions, limit gatherings in your home, wear masks, and make plans for the upcoming holidays that limit the number of people together indoors. Think: Safer. Smaller. Smarter.

Benefits Open Enrollment Runs through Nov. 13

Human Resources has announced a "change-only" Open Enrollment period (Nov. 2 to Nov. 13) for benefit options this year. Employees who are not changing medical plans or adding/dropping dependents on their medical and dental plans are not required to access the information. The exception to this is those wishing to participate in one of the Flexible Spending Accounts for Health Care or Dependent Care in 2021.
