The City of Spokane Weekly News Update for Sept. 28

Information about COVID-19 is evolving rapidly, and our important work as a City is continuing. We want to make sure our City employees have up-to-date information on both COVID and employee news. We will provide this update, as needed, to communicate what you need to know, while we work to reduce the spread of this disease in our community and continue to provide critical public services.

A Message from Mayor Woodward

The prolonged intensity and focus on managing the impacts of the health pandemic makes it easy to lose track of other things. Protecting the public health of our community is critically important and never far from our mind. And, while the pandemic has forced us all to adjust our thinking, and in many instances reprioritize our work, it has not stopped us from moving other incredibly important priorities forward.

This month alone is a great example. City resources and partnerships have advanced the regional shelter system, refocused on neighborhood and downtown cleanup activities, enhanced behavioral health resources, and established a central point of contact for discrimination concerns.

Specifically, we have:

- Introduced greater predictability in shelter service connectivity and staffing through a year-round contract for day use and nightly drop-in services, ending the seasonal nature of the provider relationship
- Added a resource to move people out of homelessness through an intentional, intensive bridge housing program
- Improved downtown and neighborhood environments by restoring cleanup resources, introducing new crews and partnerships, and emphasizing the removal of abandoned vehicles
- Added a Civil Rights coordinator as a community technical expert
- Expanded behavioral health resources through co-deployment teams that partner police officers and behavioral health specialists and the opening of the Spokane Regional Stabilization Center as an alternative resource for those in crisis
- Worked closely as a City government to develop a thoughtful plan for deployment of federal pandemic relief dollars over the next three years to assist with community impacts and the continue delivery of critical local governmental services

More is on the way as we work on a plan to extend the deadline to next spring to establish a plan to repay City utility bills that have fallen behind and propose a 2022 budget that prioritizes the services you expect the City to deliver.

These critical services are being delivered by City employees who continue to work tirelessly to meet community needs.
