Information about COVID-19 is evolving rapidly, and our important work as a City is continuing. We want to make sure our City employees have up-to-date information on both COVID and employee news. We will provide this update, as needed, to communicate what you need to know, while we work to reduce the spread of this disease in our community and continue to provide critical public services.

A Message from Mayor Woodward

Peer recognition is one of the most important ways you can show that you value a colleague and teammate. This group of Employee of the Quarter nominees for the fourth quarter has earned our appreciation and thank you for the trust, integrity, quality, teamwork, accountability, openness, innovation, diversity, and sense of community they have demonstrated.

They have worked through some pretty challenging circumstances with a can-do attitude and focused determination to deliver the outcomes those they are serving expect.

The nominees are:

- **Donald Coley** in Accounting, who through a significant amount of transition has maintained an outstanding attitude and willingness to pick up and help where there are gaps.

- The **Water Emergency Response Crews** for their work keeping the City's infrastructure running through the impact of the harsh winter elements.

UPDATE: WA Cares Fund

As you know, taxation of employees in Washington State for the new WA Cares Fund (Long-Term Care Tax) was to begin January 2022 for those employees who had not purchased a private policy by the deadline.

On January 27, 2022, Governor Jay Inslee signed two bills passed by the Legislature making key improvements to WA Cares Fund. These reforms will address coverage gaps and delay program implementation by 18 months. Changes include the following:

- Workers near retirement (born before 1968) will be able to qualify for partial benefits on a pro-rated basis.
- Workers who live out-of-state and work in Washington, military spouses, workers on non-immigrant visas and certain veterans with disabilities will be able to opt out of the program if they choose.
- Workers will begin contributing to the fund in July 2023

There will likely be additional modifications to the bill. We will keep you updated as the changes are made.
