Wildfire Smoke Emergency Rule Update

Smoke from wildfires contains chemicals, gases, and fine particles that can harm health. These particles can get deep into the lungs, worsening existing health conditions like asthma, negatively impacting heart health, and increasing the risk of death. WA State has updated its wildfire smoke emergency rule which goes into effect from June 15 – Sept. 30.

- 69 AQI Provide training to employees utilizing the Fact Sheet.
- 101 AQI Alert employees of the increased AQI and provide respirators for employees voluntary use. Implement smoke mitigation measures. Refer to the <u>Wildfire Smoke</u> <u>Program</u>.
- 150 AQI All Aquatic and outdoor recreation programs will be suspended.
- 201 AQI Hazard pay is initiated for affected employees
- **250 AQI** Safe air centers activated.
- 300+ AQI All non-emergency work will be suspended.

The suicide of a child of any age presents unique circumstances that intensify and prolong the mourning of parents, family members, and friends. Suicide is believed to be a reaction to overwhelming feelings of loneliness, worthlessness, helplessness, hopelessness, and depression. Suicide is the third leading cause of death in the United States among 10 to 14-year-olds and 15- to 24-year-olds, and the second leading cause among 25 to 34-year-olds.

While mental illness often plays a role in suicide, not everyone who dies by suicide is mentally ill. Some families have experienced years of treatments, hospitalizations, and medications with their child, while some experience none at all.
