Roof Replacement Project

Post Street is closed and no on-street parking is available between Spokane Falls Boulevard and the Post Street Bridge as construction crews replace the roof of City Hall. The Spokane Falls Boulevard and Post Street public and employee entrances are open!

As work on the roof proceeds, there will be slight disruptions on the 7th floor during the relocation of the roof drains, which will require drilling through the concrete roof structure and alterations to the drain lines above the 7th floor drop ceiling. Facilities will make every attempt to provide notice in advance of that work to allow for any adjustments to staff working locations and hours.
