City Hall Construction

The Facilities Department is coordinating the replacement of the roof at City Hall. This work includes the removal of the existing roofing material and insulation, relocation of multiple roof drains, installation of new insulation which will meet current energy codes, and a new roof membrane on each of the five various roof sections of City Hall.

Post Street is closed between Spokane Falls Boulevard and the Post Street Bridge through May (weather permitting). All employee entrances are open and the Post Street public entrance will reopen Wednesday, April 5.

As work on the roof proceeds, there will be slight disruptions on the 7th floor during the relocation of the roof drains, which will require drilling through the concrete roof



structure and alterations to the drain lines above the 7th floor drop ceiling. Work necessary to relocate the first roof drain is currently scheduled for the week of Monday, April 10 (weather permitting) and is expected to take two days. More specific information will be provided as it becomes available. The second drain (east end) is tentatively scheduled for the first week of May. Facilities will make every attempt to provide notice in advance of that work to allow for any adjustments to staff working locations and hours.
